The BK12 '2030' Vision Map





Martin from the Resilience Project keeps us entertained and engaged as we learn about our emotions, feelings, actions and moods. Most recently, our focus has been on Gratitude. 
Nature Scavenger Hunt



Our classrooms are spaces where students learn new skills, test out ideas and work collaboratively. We are so proud of the hard work and achievements of all our students throughout Term 3. It has been fantastic to see students engage in their new electives and continue to strive to achieve their best in all core subjects.

Across this term in English, students have investigated different types of texts and genres, looking at the way stories are told and how this influences the perspectives of the reader. They have also honed their analytical thinking, discussing themes and mood within texts before applying this in their own writing.

In Maths, students have investigated the real-life applications of knowledge in percentages, decimals and fractions looking into simple interest, discounts and GST. They then moved onto Algebra, stretching their thinking by understanding the parts of an expression, substituting values and then using their knowledge to expand and factorise expressions.

Our elective subjects have seen students continue to develop their culinary expertise, develop skills in coding, understand the use of perspective and colour in artworks and photography, understand the importance of teamwork in sports and undertake work in designing with a range of materials.

We have loved seeing students challenge themselves in their learning and demonstrating resilience across this term. As the term ends, we encourage both students and parents to login to Compass to check Progress Reports as well as Common Assessment Task feedback to reflect on Term 3 and set goals for Term 4.

"The Youth Hive is a wonderful place young people of Knox can come and study or connect with our friends — I've got a number of friends who are here today," Matthew says.

"it's a really good space that's safe for all. I go to school in Boronia and after school we all catch the first bus to the Youth Hive. To be able to come here is such a good opportunity that we have." The Youth Hive offers a range of workshops, activities and programs, including artificial intelligence, exploring career options and reviewing your resume.

"There are lots of different workshops offered, which is a brilliant opportunity for us to build on ourselves and lean into our skills," Matthew says. "The resume workshop was really good because they were able to critique what I had and give me lots of feedback, which will help in the real world.

I've been to a number of writers' workshops here as well and it's been really fun to work on my writing skills and be given tips on how to improve."

On Wednesdays when local schools finish up early, there's quiet study time

from 2pm-4pm, drawing people like Maria.

"It's a quiet place that's got lots of room for studying and it's really accepting," she says. "I come here to study and just hang out with friends."






KIOSK - Year 8 Excursion




Outdoor Education - Get Wild

As we wrap up Term 3, we look forward to more exciting adventures in Term 4. The energy and passion of our students ensure there are plenty of outdoor experiences yet to come!


